

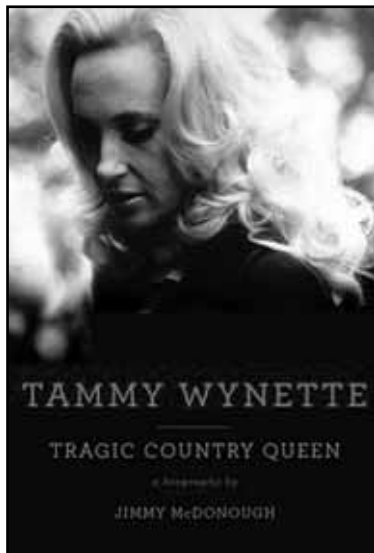
Stand by, you fans, for Tammy Wynette biographer event

Combining pop musicology and tabloid gossip, McDonough has crafted a fitting tribute to a country music icon.
