

KENYAN REFUGEE CAMP OFFERS BELEAGUERED SOMALIS REFUGE

The protons of the layer of a quarter million - Order 19769 cite concerns that there is an in-Somall refugees, deepenvie to escape unit-th-onable living conditions in a country wroaght with warand destitute powerty, is will in limbo deeptie a recent ruling from the Kenyan high court against the closure of the Dadash refugeecamp. A decision made in May 2016 to close the

Dadash refugee camp on the border of Kenya, one of the largest refugee camps in the world, was overlamed on Feb. 9. The camp is located north of Natroini, near the border of Somalia, and is currently home to nearly 150,000 refugrees. The plan is forcibly relocate thousands of refusies, many of whom are Somalis who have ideals. ded from their dyal war-stricken naitee home. The was deemed a discriminatory move targeted at Somalis. Somalis have been enrighting to Dedait and major three twee engetting 10 Dedait and major titles in Kenya ever since the warpenied in 1991.


In this current political climate, the decision to protect the rights of the refugeer represents a necessary counteraction to secent decisions made by the Trump editation to ben trated between the United States and several countries, including these from the Dadash refuges camp. Both the Kenyan government prior to this judge's decision and Trump's Executive

creased risk of terrorist activity from Somali people that live in Dadash and similar refugee camps, a claim which has not been substanti-ated. Because of this hysteria, Sonalis Ibring in Dataab faced a harsh reality, being for fifty located from the relages camp implace for where it go. and hereing no plan

The Genera Convention of 1994 states it is theohiligation of all nations to protect the rights of setupses, and the United States has histori-cally prioritized immigration of redupes. The Kenyan judge's decision to resetum the closure of Decision refugee camp is in line with these

The Kenvan dovernment has already appeaked this decision, but if they do close the doors to this camp or continue to violate the rights of Somali refugies, they could loss-finan-chi support from other countries dedicated to the purpose of curbing this spidemic. If the Tramp administration replaces the

The biggest issue with the film is the premise, as the film is based on one paragraph from the opening crawl of "A New Hope," it has about as much depth as such with the characters and story. Thus, there's a lack of suspense, because you know what has to happen in order for the events of "A New Hope" to take place. If the film never got made, nothing would be missed.

While it's undeniable that last year's "The Force Awakens" borrowed a lot from "A New Hope," it at least gave us interesting characters in Finn and Rey and ended with enough room to explore for future episodes. "Rogue One" is just your average mega-blockbuster popcorn flick with good moments of action but with shallow characters to lead the narrative. Despite trying to fill in some blanks in "A New Hope," the film has little to no impact on how you view that classic.

Aside from a few memorable shots and an action-packed finale, the film doesn't have enough substance in it's narrative to justify its existence in the Star Wars universe. Which is a shame, as the climactic beach raid and Darth Vader's two scenes are some of the best Star Wars moments that have been glorified on the big screen (so far). At





atified on December 15, 791, the United States Bill. of Rights added the first ten amondments to the United States Constitution. Among the included rights

are free speech, as noted in the First Amendment, protection against unreasonable sourches and seizures, as noted in the Fourth Amendment, and the idea of separation of powers, stated in the 10th Amendment. Along with these is, perhaps, the most controversial right in today's world, the right listed by the Second Amendment of the Constitution, or the right to keep and beer arms

Hotly debuted over the decades, the intention of the Second Amendment and, until as recently as 2008, here far the right extended were unclear. The U.S. Supreme-Court decision reached during the District of Columbia y. Heller case belowd clarify this aspect, but it hasn't stopped many from arguing against the decision, or even against the very existence of the amendment.

But how important is our right to beer arms, really? The Second Amendment of the Constitution states: "A well regulated militia, being necessary to the security of a free state, the right of the people to knep and bear arms, shall not be infringed."

Throughout the history of our country, there have been substantial disagreements about the meaning of this text. Some argue that the amendment was supposed to apply only to specific, organized bedies, such as the police force or the national goard. Others argue that the amendment applies to all citizens. But which interpretation is correct? In order to make this determination, it's important to look at our country's

felt, for a variety of reasons, that they were not being granted the rights that should have been granted to them as Englishmen. Due to their lack of representation within the British government, they believed laws, such as the Sugar Act of 1764, were a violation of their rights. This, along with many other grievances and the growing differences is colonial society, led to events such as the Boston Tea Party, which escalated into the Revolutionary Way

Despite their desire for independence, though, the colonists were ill-prepared to fight a war with the gave them unique wiedom regarding the dangers of better-equipped British Army, and the war was long and bloody, lasting nearly eight and a half years. Though independence was won, many today believe that if the trip from England to the colonies were less treacherous, the fight would have been nearly impossible.

But how do these events play into the decision to include the Second Amendment in the Bill of Rights?

Army, the Founding Fathers understood the dangers of a potentially tyrannical government who wielded significantly more power than the people it served. They understood that if the people did not have the ability to defend themselves from this kind of government, there was a chance that the country could and up in the same position they had found themselves in with the British government. Though the Supreme Court has ruled that the Second Amendment applies to personal protection (see the District of Columbia v. Heller), that was not the amondment's original intent. It wasn't to protect against thieves or marderers, but to protect the people against tyraney, or perhaps against foreign invaders, should the need arise.

George Mason, known as the father of the Bill of Rights, spoke during Virginia's Ratifying Convention - Second Amendment about advice given to the British Parliament before the war: "To disarm the people ... is the most effectual way to enginee them."

This, above all size, defines my stance on the Second Amendment. The Founding Pathers' experiences tytanny; leading to their decision to include the Second Amendment in our Bill of Rights.

In a perfect world, we will never have to use our right to keep and bear arms for their original intention. We will never have to defend against a foreign invader or a tyrannical government. The possibility of the latter seems about in today's world, after all. But if the need should arise, the American people are prepared.

Deadliest mass shooting in Portland history fading from memory

If you've ever eaten at Pine Street Market, you're dining near one of the most deadly tragedies in recent Portland history, and you would probably never know. Portland and the survivors of a shooting outside The Zone, a defunct all-ages nightclub, are trying to move on from that winter night almost ten years ago.

In 2009, Erik Salvador Ayala perpetuated what was, for a three-year period, the deadliest in Portland or Oregon's modern history. The shooting would later be eclipsed by the Clackamas Town Center Shooting of 2012, the Reynolds High School Shooting of 2014 and the Umpgua Community College Shooting of 2015. Previously, a 1998 Springfield school shooting held this record, after two students died and 25 people were injured.

News reports at the time highlighted local shock at the random brutality of a crime now too commonplace across the nation. But The Zone's survivors' private lives quietly unfolding over the past decade, along with Pine Street Market now sharing The Zone's address and a million-dollar lawsuit related to the death of Peruvian national Martha Paz de Noboa Delgado, are the only reminders the public has of the terrible, still-motiveless tragedy. One might ask: should there be any more permanent reminder of that senseless violence?

It's hard to say how to most appropriately remember the tragedy, when it is offensively near-obvious that the United States has learned nothing about how to prevent mass shootings, and Portland still struggles with other issues that seem related to the shooting, like affordable access to mental healthcare, housing and human services.

Old Town-Chinatown was just last month the site of a drive-by shooting that left one man dead. Pine Street Market's neighborhood still struggles with aggressive people often associated with substance abuse, mental health crises and houselessness, as cited among the reasons for the recent closure of Old Town's neighboring Thirsty Lion.



College instructor investigated for falsi

Clackamas Community College last year investigated one of its most high-profile instructors for falsifying student records, according to documents provided to The Clackamas Print. Andy Mingo, who won the prestigious 2015 Governor's Award for Innovation, resigned in the wake of the investigation into the offense, which could have been grounds for termination. The sudden resignation in the middle

of winter term on Feb. 5, 2016 ended his 12-year career at the college where he earned more than \$78,000 per year.

The documents disclose that Mingo, 45, was accused of faisifying grade records. likely those of his wife, Lidia Yuknavitch, 53, a famous Portland author and Mt. Hood Community College instructor, who earned her PhD in English from the University of Oregon in 1998.

While Mingo's college teaching career at Clackamas was ending, Yuknavitch's literary career was rising. Last spring, she won the Oregon Book Award. Her latest novel, "The Book of Joan," earned a glowing review last month on the cover of The New York Times Book Review, which called her work "brilliant" and incendiary.

Mingo, who was a full-time faculty member and instructor of Digital Media Communications at the college, cited "personal matters" as the reason for his resignation in an email to Art Department Chair Nora Brodnicki. According to his attorney, Mingo denies the allegations, adding that it wasn't worth it to him to fight the accusations when he had other opportunities in filmmaking to pursue.

The records obtained by The Print through Oregon Public Records Law reveal the outlines of the investigation. Dean of Arts and Sciences Sue Goff conducted the initial review, documents show. It's unclear how far back in Mingo's teaching capeer the college researched in its prview.

"It is my opinion that charges of falsifying grade records and course related or required documents should be brought against you," Goff said in an email to Mingo on Jan. 5, 2016 under the subject line "investigation decision." Goff declined to comment to The Print.

In her email, Goff referred to a provision of the Full-Time Faculty Agreement that governs instructors at the college. That provision states that a complaint against a faculty member, if true, could lead to

termination for unprofessional conduct. Neither Mingo nor Yuknavitch responded directly to multiple requests for comment in April and May, Instead, all comments came from their attorney, Lisanne Buttenfield, who initially called and sent emails threatening to sue student reporters for invasion of the couple's privacy. Mingo, Yuknavitch and Butterfield declined to comment on Yuknavitch's involvement, citing the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act, or FERPA, which protects student information.

"We want to make sure that we're preserving the fact that her academic records are not going to be disclosed," said Butterfield.

In the email to Mingo, Goff listed the material that she reviewed to arrive at her decision, which included 54 class rosters. Cooperative Work Experience application (the college's

internship program) for "a student," whose name was reducted from the copy that The Print received. The college The collage assigning a grade." because of FERPA.

Goff noted Matthew Warren was listed as the student's CWE employer and supervisor at Chiasmus Press, a publisher founded by Mingo and Yuknavitch. They launched Chiasmus as a counterpoint to Pacific Northwest literary culture, which Yuknavitch described online as "salmon, old growth, and dusty poet dudes."

In an email on Dec. 17, 2016 to Goff, Warren wrote that he was not the student's CWE employer at any time. "If there is paperwork showing otherwise. I would very much like to see

it," Warren said in the email to Goff. Warren declined to comment. In the Jan. 5 email to Mingo, Goff further

described her findings. "Based on my review of these

materials," Goff said in the email, "I found evidence of your passing at least

one student [redacted] without any basis for assigning a grade. The records indicate that [redacted] erroneously claimed Matthew Warren as [redacted] CWE employer without his knowledge. She added: "It is my finding that you had direct knowledge that Matthew Warren was not the CWE employer, and that you assigned a false grade to [redacted].

Additionally, several of the class costers I reviewed had very few students listed and in the case of three classes, only [redacted] was enrolled."

The college registrar confirmed in an email that Yuknavitch was enrolled at CCC from fall 2008 to fall 2005 with a major listed as "entry level multimedia journalist." While the college would not disclose Yuknavitch's name on investigative reports regarding Mingo due to FERPA, it is allowed to release information such She also looked at grade transcripts and a as dates of enrollment and area of study. is teaching in the email that English instructor American Literature, Creative Writing and Introduction to Women's Studies during spring term, according to MHCC. Yuknavitch's writing explicitly details her personal life, including how she met Mingo when he was a graduate student of hers at San Diego State University and a play by play of their first sexual encounter.

In her February 2016 TED talk titled, "Lidia Yuknavitch: the beauty of being a misfit," Tuknavitch describes some of her life story.

"I've funited out of college, not once, but twice, and maybe even a third time that I'm not going to tell you about," Yuknavitch said in the TED talk, filmed around the time of Mingo's resignation. Goff said in the Jan. 6 email to Mingo that she would forward the results of her investigation to Patricia Anderson

Wieck, the dean of human resources at the college. Anderson Wieck would not comment on the matter.

In late January 2016, the college hired Portland lawyer Chrys Martin of the Davis Wright Tremaine law firm in Portland to "perform an independent personnel investigation," per an email from the law firm to then Vice President of College Services Jim Huckestein. It's unclear whether Martin was hired to investigate Mingo or another employee.

The college paid a total of \$13,531.50 to the firm, according to invoices. But in response to The Print's request for documents, the college denied being in possession of any notes from Martin, and cited attorney-client privilege.

On Feb. 5, 2016, Mingo resigned his full-time faculty position and signed an agreement under which he agreed to 'never knowingly apply to the CCC for any job or position in the future⁸ and to return all property to the college. The college agreed to provide a letter of reference, but the resignation agreement also included a non-disparagement clause.

The non-disparagement clause begins The parties agree that neither party shall make disparaging or damaging remarks to the media or other third parties about one another, and that any such remarks would constitute a breach of this agreement."

After Mingo and Huckestein signed the agreement, Anderson Wieck sent an email to college officials including President Joanne Truesdell under the subject line, pon-disparagement instructions and process." which included language that she and CCC's attorney had agreed to send to certain faculty members.

A notice of Mingo's resignation was sent to some staff on Feb. 8, 2006.

"We thank Instructor Mingo for all his contributions to the College community and wish him the best in his future endeavors," Anderson Wieck said in the email to staff.

After Mingo left the college, he has continued to pursue filmmaking. He is currently working with "Fight Club" author Chuck Palahniuk on a movie adaption of Palahniuk's novel "Lullaby."



Ashland's Air Quality Index (AQE) rose into the Red, Unhealthy Lovel and Purple, Very Unhealthy Lovel this week. A Red Lovel means "Everyone may begin to experience health effects; members of sensitive groups may experience more serious health effects." A Purple AQE is considered a health alert and reads, "Everyone may experience more serious health effects." The index ranges from 0- 50 (good) to 505-500 (heardous). On Monday, Ashland's was 245.

Just last week, SOU's football team had to move their game to Sherwood. High School in Sherwood, Ore. because of similar conditions. Other fail sports teams must now take the air quality into consideration. According to Athletic Director Matt Sayre, "practices can be conducted at the orange level, but once it gets into the red they have to be moved inside." This year, there have been 2,048 terror attacks and 7,124 fatalities throughout the world, according to a collaboration between Earl Story Maps and PesceTech Lab using crowdsourced Wikipedia data.

Of those attacks, so 4 fatalities were in the U.S. compared to the 655 fatalities and 59 terror attacks in Somalia just in 2017. In Iraq, there were 559 fatalities from 32 attacks this year. Forty percent of the deaths due to terror attacks this year were in Islamic states

This is a worldwide humanitarian issue, and yet we, the mainstream American media focus on just a sliver of how large this issue really is. What makes a costume disrespectful?


No, it doesn't matter if your bestie claimed that costume in September. What matters? Disrespecting a cultural identity or perpetuating sexist stereotypes, not your friend's dibs. After all, there's no shame in twinning. There is in abusing another culture.

Halloween is just around the corner, and with the spooky holiday comes an annual pointed discussion: how do you avoid cultural appropriation? For those who don't know, cultural appropriation, at its most basic level, is where cultural objects are copied from a minority culture by a dominant culture, and these elements are used outside of their original cultural context (as "cute" or "exotic" clothes or a funny joke).







Last week, the Vangaard ran a story, "Proud? Unapologetic white nationalists prefer psuedonym." This has sparked questions about the Vangaard's intent in doing so. Below is a response from the Vangaard's International Editor, Alex-Jon Earl.

WHITE SUPREMACISTS ON CAMPUS, A RESPONSE TO THE RESPONSE

When I started writing for the *Portland State Vanguard*, it was because I wanted to bring my unique perspective to the paper. That has not changed. In fact, if anything, that is something I'm even more committed to now. I feel this is something far more important than over given the times.

I understand the apprehension that some may feel when it comes to the media.

As the "fourth estate," we are supposed to be the ones keeping the populace informed, fact-checking when necessary, alerting our community of transgressions against society. And yet, some fed that the recent results of the election is largely due to a failing on our part. Frustration with the media, then, is high.

Clearly this frustration is not limited to corporate, nonprofit, and more professional media. Even student media has felt the blowback. In recent days we have seen our efforts to inform and alert students in these trying times undermined. Certain people have organized, on social media and elsewhere, to discard our papers, disfigure them, or simply leave horrible things in our press box. As an editor and journalist this is offensive, but as myself, a 2-Spirit Comanche person, this is disheartening.

I did not come to Portland State University for this sort of thing.

I was the one who found the white supremacist flyer and identified the group behind it that spurred on the story. If it were not for my diligence, it wouldn't have been a story. How many students, then, would have been surprised or shocked at what is increasingly be coming regular incidents of hateful defacement?

This is how journalism should work.

I am very proud of how the story turned out, and I'm very gled that the story does a great job of explaining why these people put up this sort of fiver and why they are actively working on campus they are white supremacists. The surcastic, appropriated imagery used on the cover and in the article also explains something important: it advertises notice, urges awareness and uses the white supremacist organization's own efforts for recruitment as a tool to ridicule them.

There isn't any space on Portland-area campuses for hateful recruitment and propagaoda. The Waguerd is making that clear by identifying these factics in an academically and historically accurate way to utilize what we at PSU are taught in a way that directly confronts them. However, ignoring the mances of this is creeping too close to the kind of ignorance these white supremacists are preying on.

The Vergeerd works hard to bring students away from this precipice in a helpful and unbiased way.

In my work with the Vergeard I have worked to boost marginalized volces. My first works highlighted a queer artist, Logan Lynn, and the Native American Student and Community Center, a center many of you readers may not be well acquainted with. I have worked hard to bring in perspectives that have been overlooked or ignored. I have uplified our Indigenous Water Protectors at Standing Rock, worked with Las Majeres to bring notice to Latin Night, and I am working even harder on more stories in the coming weeks centering on marginalized peoples, including more on Indigenous education and resistance.

I can only speak for myself, truly, but when I say I am proud of the Venyseré, I truly mean it.

As a 2-Spirit Comanche, I put my life at risk day in and day out just by living out and freely. Even survived violence of all sorts, physical, verbal and emotional, and I will continue to endure because that is the Nemenon way. Even when I see inklings of the kind of rhetoric that leads to violence coming from people who otherwise would be on "my side," I tell myself, as I always do, that my ancestors, from Quanah on one side and Comanche Jack on the other, would tell me that all I can really do is survive.

And that everything else is leading when called to. Thank you for reaching the Vasguard.



Overcoming the impossible

FORMER CCC WRESTLER HAS BEEN ABLE TO FIGHT ADDICTION, NOW SHARES STORY OF SUCCESS

Richard Jensen may not be a name that

you will remember, but once you know his story you will remember it forever. Jensen grew up in a home with a good family, values and morals. At a young

age, he began wrestling and from there it would stick with him for life. "I was very hyperactive, had a tough

time paying attention, very distracted and when I found wrestling, it was like medicine," said Jensen.

After graduating high school Jensen left to go fishing in Alaska. Troubles came about when the lack of structure, wrestling, left his life. He was exposed to the world, in an environment with drugs and alcoholism. The lifestyle on and off the boats was work hard, play hard.

"It really beat me up fast," said Jensen. "It took me to that place where things were real foggy. I got just enough off track that I couldn't quite get back on track and go to college.

After being caught in the lifestyle, Jensen describes the struggle with addiction as something that evolved and slowly took the life out of him. Addiction

took away his dreams, his visions and his aspirations, making everyday life much more difficult. Over a 15 year period, Jensen found

himself in and out of prison and separated from his family. When in jail, Jensen was constantly thinking about wrestling, knowing how it helped him stay on track. After trying treatment over five times, Jensen never found any luck.

In 2003, after being at the lowest point in his life, Jensen found himself in the Oregon State Penitentiary. Shortly after being in prison Jensen learned that his mother had cancer. After a month into his sentence, he heard the news of his mother passing.

"I believe she's watching me, but if I could sit down and have her for a minute, that would be incredibly awesome," said Jensen. "I would say I'm sorry for putting her through those nights of worrying and thank her for my upbringing."

Jensen was released from prison in 2004 and knew that if he could have wrestling in his life again, he would have a chance at sobriety. In 2006, Jensen knew that

he wanted to be part of a team again, he found that team at Clackamas Community College

"I didn't expect to win a lot of matches," said Jensen. "The goal wasn't to get my hand raised. It was to win my life back. It was much bigger than a wrestling match.⁸

Jensen talked with former athletic director, Jim Jackson, about joining the team and learned how difficult it would be to make the team at age 36. Knowing

that this had to be done, Jensen accepted all feats that would follow. In 2006-07, current wrestling coach Josh Rhoden was in his first season as head coach at Clackamas and recalled the first meeting of the season

Jensen upeaks in front of the students for Bela Champion in Life.

"The mood was instantly lightened in our first team meeting when he walked into Randall sos ahead of me, the 26-yearold 'new coach.' and he was asked. 'Are you the new coach?' Bichard, 10 years my senior, says, 'No I'm here to try out for wrestling,¹¹¹ said Rhoden.

Not only is it difficult to make a college wrestling team, but doing it on a Top-10 nationally ranked team and at the age of 36 with limited physical activity for 35 years, it is nearly impossible. In his first season, Jensen struggled to find wins, but after a long offseason he came back in the best shape of his life, winning more matches in the first tournament of his second season than he did all of his first season

"You get a few windows of opportunity in your life and this was mine," said lensen. "I needed to comnete on the mat

Mt. Hood men streak into the playoffs



Hardcore fans of the Call of Duty franchise can now pick up their newest addition: Call of Duty WW2, developed by Sledgehammer games (last release was by Infinity Ward). The fast-paced first person shooter had a midnight release Nov. 2.

Call of Duty WW2 tells the grim story of World War II. For example, the game's campaign mode starts players off directly in the battle as they storm Normandy Beach evading machine gun turrets while watching fellow soldiers take heavy casualties.

With all the questions and excitement in the air. many people are curious about Sledgehammer's approach to the game's multiplayer and zombie game

I bought and downloaded the game Nov. 2 on its early elease night, and I can say

that after the first couple of hours waiting for bugs to be patched. I was very amazed with the game and its three different modes, campaign, multiplayer, and Nazi zombies

In fact, at 9 p.m. I was at GameStop picking up the game. At 9:20 p.m., I started downloading it. The game's multiplayer servers were down, so I started with campaign mode, and it wasn't until 11:40 p.m. that the multi-player servers were up. At 12:06 a.m., I was still unable to load a multi-player game. At 12:12, I was finally able to start playing online in multiplayer mode. Being a fan of Call of Duty, I was

committed to get into a game no matter how long it took. As said earlier, the game's campaign mode is an emotional roller-coaster but also a very fun experience. I was only able to play the first


did add a few new aspects.

Earlier in previous Call of Duty games, if your player's health decreased you simply ran to cover and your health automatically regenerated. In WW2, you have medical kits that you have to use to bandage vourself to gain health. You

either find them throughout the game or take them from a solider who gives them to you over time. The campaign also contains good commentary from actual actors such as Josh Duhamel (Transformers),

Jonathan Tucker (The Texas Chainsaw Massacre, Sleepers) and Jeffrey Pierce (The Stranger Ŵithin). The multiplayer game

mode is also very enjoyable. This new Call of Duty does, however, now have a new 'Headquarters'' that is a sort of main lobby where players can take their customized character and walk around and do several activities such as training, one-versus-one



battles and a shooting range to practice with new unlocked

The game also has supply drops which fall from the sky and give players different types of calling cards, emblems and other personal items.

All of these new features aside, the game has amazingly smooth gameplay. It was the most clear picture I have seen in a Call of Duty game in a

The game's Nazi zombie mode is a gamemode where players can play together or solo and fight their way through as many waves of zombies as possible. The mode was given some new additions to previous games' zombie modes by adding things such as different classes which have a variety of perks and special abilities. Players are also able to



If the ghost of Elliot Smith joined forces with The Fixies the result would be the experimental pop sound of The Juniper Berries. Their debut album, *Don't Eventh In Through Your Month* not only demonstrates the band's obvious musical provess but also their dynamic as a group.

The band started as the brainchild of Joahua Stirm, a current third-year at Southern Oregon University. In late 2015 he released a solo EP, titled *Barby Face*, in which he wrote and performed all of the instrumental parts. After asking close friend and drummer, Alec Moore, to help provide some drum parts for his early songs, their collaboration quickly turned into a live incarnation of Baby Face-era songs. Following Alec's inauguration was Nina Myers on keyboard and finally, Jesse Erils-Adams on bass.

Don't Ereath In Through Your Mouth was written and recorded in a handful of different houses, dorms, porches, garages, and soveral other locations around Ashland. Unlike most bands today, The Juniper Berries don't rely on fancy digital recording gaar and expensive instruments. The album instead was recorded on 4-track tape and then digitalized after. Despite the risk of poor sound quality, the group faced the challenge of lo-fi recording head on, producing a unique homemade sound.



Counter Review: "Mr. Burns"

What follows is a review by student writer Darwin Garrett. The views do not represent the editorial opinions or content of The Siskiyou or Southern Oregon University.

I am not opposed to reviews of Southern Oregon University (SOU) theater productions. To the contrary: more people should have the courage to share their thoughts on what they think and how they feel about plays. Theater should make you feel things, shouldn't it? Constructive criticism should be welcome in the artistic community, but I found Siskiyou student-writer, Eyrie Hughes' review lacking an attention to detail that makes the critique of a piece like "Mr Burns: a Post-Electric Play" absent of real criticisms.

When I watched SOU's production of "Mr. Burns," I formed many opinions. This is natural: I am an opinionated person, particularly after a play. I am not impartial, I know many of the artists who worked on the "Mr. Burns," Biases acknowledged, I believe Hughes' review is ignorant of a nuanced and well-informed production.

Ultimately, Hughes is right: the audience did not receive a play-by-play of the lives and details of every single member of the group of survivors-turned-artists. But would you watch a play where every, excruciating, minutiae, is explained in aganizing detail? Washburn showed us what was important in the script, and left out what was not. What happoned to the characters in the sevenyear time skip wasn't important. But the point of the second act: that theater was still alive and well in this post-electric world, was important.

A playweight never includes anything 'meaningless' in a production. Every anecdote had ideas about struggles in a post-spoealyptic world. Due to word count, I cannot go into exactly why I thought that Washburn included the anecdotes about men failing to save an un-salvageable world, or the bitter nostalgia of wanting something as simple as a Diet Coke- new only a memory. But if I did, I certainly would tell you why I cared about something 'meaningless' like Diet Cokes.


IN THE LAST TEN YEARS, textbook prices increased 63 percent and are growing factor than all other college costs, including taition and fees. Textbook publishing is an eligopoly. Due to the lask of competition, large companies completely control the prices of textbooks and other mandatory services sold to students. Pearson, in particular, stands out a head above the rest. Pearson monopolized standardized testing in K-12 and college textbooks, and they are currently sinking their claws

It seems like something out of a weird, insper-conitalist days topian future, but that future is improving now. Poursen and similar publishers sell horaework to students through digital learning systems, like Pearson's MyLab and McGraw-Hill's Consist. Essentially, these companies expect and require studenis to may for access to necessary conversion's and grade information. For the most part, this also includes an electronic curv of a textbook that students cannot keep or result which undermines the used textbook industry.

I understand why instructors might outsource some of their rock to these systems from big publishers. However, it is not fair, in this author's opinion, to ask students to pay for it. If a professor created assignments of their own and asleed students to pay to access the assignment, how would the student body and university react? Why, then, are current PSU students paying publishing companies for required coursework? Why does PSU expect us to pay for H7

What exactly are students paying for when they pay taition and course fees if it does not include homework and homework grades? Is this shift toward education is is carte accept-able? Serve quick back of the suvelope math shows that just one class of 27 students using Connect brings McGrew-Hill \$1,240 per semester. Just ten courses using learning merugemont systems for three semesters a year comes up just under \$100,000 going from students directly to publishers for access to their homework. A student taking two classes per term sect is not that uncommon at least in the School of Business at PSU, and over three terms students would spend

8720 just to access their textbook and coursework. By slowly eliminating the domand for teachers to create and grade assignments, publishers created yet another mar-leet to be monopolized. Students are already trapped under the ever-increasing cost of new textbooks and near con-



According to the most recent Securities and Exchange Commission filing for McGraw-Hill, digital sales have sur-passed textbook sales. Digital sales increased 04 percent in just one year. McGraw-Hill and their competitoes place priceity on strategy that expands their reach and market saturation for digital learning systems.



IT'S TIME TO ACKNOWLEDGE AND IDENTIFY THE REPETITIVE PROFILE OF MASS SHOOTERS IN THE UNITED STATES

SANDY HOOK, CHARLESTON, LAS VISOAS, Umpqua, Suther-land Springs, and so on. The emotional wounds have hardly begun to heal from the last mass shooting when the next one takes place. People in this country are dving because hateful. calloused individuals are collecting arsenals of weapons and slaughtering their follow officens.

After every shorting, calls for gan reform are rebuked as being insensitive to the victims and those affected by these homile acts of violence whose deaths "should not be po-lificized." Thoughts and prayers are sent. Republicans in Congress tell us nothing could have been done to prevent the nurders from happening. Speaker of the United States House of Representatives Paul Ryan said Texas church shooter Devin Kelley shouldn't have had the ability to purchase firearms, and the existing laws should have been enforced.

However, even if the laws that are in place had been enforced, it would still not have been enough. Most incidents of domestic violence aren't reported, and even if they were, vioient men still wouldn't be prevented from purchasing guns. If an individual is prevented from owning a gun, are we going to follow through and confiscate the guns they already held?

Domostic terrorism committed by white, middle-aged mer is not being taken seriously or called what it is. This is a problem that demands attention, and we as a country are failing the victims of violence by not even trying to figure out how to provent these tragedies from happening over and over again.

MASS SHOOTINGS ROOTED IN DOMESTIC VIOLENCE

Over 80 percent of mass shooters have histories of domestiz violence. Faul Ryan is right that there are laws that try to make it more difficult for people with violent pasts who've committed domestic abuse to get gams. The Air Force failed to follow Pentagon protocol that would have prevented Devin Kelley from purchasing gams but someone just forgot to file the pa-perwork. Will the Air Force be held responsible for the deaths of 26 people in Sutherland Springs? Probably not. Stop passing the blame, and start taking responsibility.

The laws Paul Ryan refers to are not effective, nor is the enforeement of them. Beyfriends and stalkers are not included in the domestic abusers that would be excluded from gun owner-ship. A bill was introduced in 2015 to help correct this problem but has literally gone nowhere. Even if all of these violent menwere entered into a database, claiming they would have been prevented from owning a gan by background checks is builshit. Some 22 percent of people undergo no background checks

when purchasing a gan. Let's be generous and say this study is incorrect. Even if 50 percent of people didn't have a background check when acquiring a gan, that's still a one in two chance that if you want to own a gan to nurder a bunch of people, you can. This means if you were a violent person who is a part of this database but just tried a few places and a couple dealers at a gun show, you'd probably end up owning your very

lo with violant histories not only need to be prevented from buying guns but also need to have their guns taken away. In #1 states, there are no requirements for domestic abusers to turn in previously purchased guns. Paul Byan is either smart by excluding these facts, or he is a fool who refuses to look into the actual policies that currently exist.





CLACKAMAS STUDENTS, ATHLETES LOSE FIRST WEEK OF CLASSES DUE TO WINTER WEATHER

With Clackamas Community College students having four weeks off after fall term due to the holiday break, many who were looking forward to the next term had to wait a bit longer.

On the evening of Tuesday, Jan. 10, snow began to fall around the Portland metropolitan area, and it piled up quickly. Oregon City received eight inches of snow. The temperature dropped over the next few days, staying below freezing, which led to canceled classes until Wednesday, Jan. 18.




Portland State Vikings Men's Basketball fell short in its bid to upset Big Sky's current conference leaders Weber State Wildcats on Feb. 11th at the Peter W. Stott Center. WSU would come away with the win in overtime 96-93. The loss dropped the Viidngs to 12-11 overall, 5-7 Big Sky, placing eighth in conference with a record of 8-3 at home.

WSU arrived at the Stott Center after a 77-74 point road loss against Sacramento State. PSU Widngs had high hopes after snapping a four-game losing streak and kept it close in the opening minutes of the game. At the 13 minute mark in the first half, the Wildcats began a run that initiated their pull away from the Vikings, extending their lead to 8 points at 22-14. Soon after, WSU extended its lead again by 10 points with a game score of 28-18.

PSU struggled to cut into WSU's lead for most of the first half before going on a run of its own. Vikings player De'Sean Parsons delivered his signature layup, putting an end to the Wildcats' opening lead. Parsons tilted the momentum in favor of the Vikings as they slowly chipped away at the lead. With 4:14 left in the first half, Montie Leunen managed to get a layup in. Leunen scored again after being fouled, allowing his free throw to cut the lead down to 1 point with a score of 32-31.

However, that was the closest the Vikings would get to leading the game as the Wildcats took advantage of Viking defense. WSU guickly extended its lead back to 8 points. In the last minute of the first half, a pair of free throws by Viking Calaen Robinson and a layup from Parsons cut the Bengal's lead down to 4 points. A dunk at the buzzer by Viking Traylin Farris was waved off for PSU. WSU lead at the half 45-41.

As the second half started, the Vikings kept the score tight with the Wildcats. At 15:45 the game was tied at 50 a piece. The game was again tied at 53 nearly a minute later and again at 57. 

National Monument at risk for Reduction

The Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument and up to nine other national monuments may soon be reduced in size. This information comes via a leaked memo from Interior Secretary Ryan Zinke to President Trump.

The Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument expanded this past January by 48,00 acres as one of President Obama's last acts in office. In April, President Trump called for the borders of any national monument over 100,000 acres to be under review. This included the Cascade-Siskiyou National monument with a total size of 112,000 acres.

The Trump Administration assigned Secretary Zinke to evaluate the borders of up to 26 land and ocean monuments with the oldest being from 1996. His evaluation concluded that up to 10 national monuments were needed to shrink in size in order to allow for "traditional" land uses to be pursued. These land uses include logging, mining, hunting, fishing, and grazing. The proposal to reduce the Cascade-Siskiyou National Monument highlighted the increase of timber production in the area.

PSU'S RECORD FRESHMAN ENROLLMENT

PSU enrolled its largest freehman class in history this year, representing both the success of PSUs Four Years Free program and recent improvements made to the admissions department.

A total of 2,015 theshness enrolled in the Fall 2017 semester, breaking PSU's prior record of 1,070 students in 2015. Of these freshness, 1,216 are first-time, full-time Oregon residents, representing a 26.5 percent increase from last year. PSU's current freshnan class makes up less than 10 per-

PSUs current freehrant class makes up less than 10 percent of PSUs total enrollment, which mostly consists of continuing student retention. This has been a tricky subject for PSU over the last several years, as retention and total enrollmentions have been dropping, taition continues to rise, and state and federal investment in higher education has fallen startly.

Director of Community Outreach and Ingegement for the Office of Global Diversity and Inclusion Ed Washington and the boost in freehman enrollment is "a matter of all hands on deck."

"I think it's just beginning to pay off nove" Washington added.
